To master anything really quickly and painlessly, say English

English is a tough and hard-to-learn subject from many students' perspective. The dread and frustration keep holding them back from making any substantial progress. To make matters worse, our minds are constantly flooded with new knowledge, homework and extra-curricular activities. In this nonstop world, when will you ever find that much time and energy to do something about that subtle and daunting language?

Here I would like to share some ideas which I take from Mr Josh Kaufman's book, 'First 20 Hours: How to Learn Anything... Fast!'. He proposed a simple and field-tested method to help us get to grips with any new things that we want to learn. His revolutionary way, condensed in merely hundreds of words, is provided as follows:

First, deconstruct the skill. Search for the ones that appear repeatedly in exams and that you are familiar with. Those are necessarily basic building blocks for you to excel in English. The more you can break apart the skill, the more you are able to decide what you have to do in order to achieve your goal, and you can practice those first.

Then, you just have to learn enough to self-correct and remove practice barriers. Do not give yourself pretexts for procrastination. For instance: I have to learn every grammar rule before practicing writing; or I have to wade through the whole dictionary before doing a reading comprehension exercise. Do it step by step, but make sure that you are moving in the right direction; in other words, the ability to self-correct.
